CEQA Public Involvement

The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) is a California statute passed in 1970 to institute a statewide policy of environmental protection. CEQA generally requires state and local government agencies to inform decision makers and the public about the potential environmental impacts of proposed projects, and to reduce those environmental impacts to the extent feasible. A key feature of the CEQA process is the opportunity for the public to review and provide input in the environmental review process and technical documents. **Public involvement is an important part of the CEQA process, which provides several opportunities for public comment.**

The CEQA process will conclude in a Programmatic Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) and the certification by the Las Virgenes-Triunfo JPA Board of Directors that CEQA requirements have been met and completed.


